Delma Ray Nash, 77, of Albemarle passed away Thursday, November 26, 2015 in Oakboro, at the home of his son. His funeral service will be held at 1PM on Tuesday in the Stanly Funeral Home Chapel with Rev. Mark Medlin and Rev. Mickey Howard officiating and burial will follow at Poplins Grove Baptist Church Cemetery.

Born May 13, 1938 in Stanly County, NC, he was the son of the late General Ray Nash and Ola Chandler Nash. He was a retired supervisor with Wiscasset Mill Co. with 40 years of service. He was a member of Mount Olive Baptist Church where he was an ordained Deacon. In later years he had been attending Tabernacle Baptist Church.
