Mrs. Inez Carnes Plyler, of Monroe, North Carolina, passed away peacefully to be with her Lord and Savior on Saturday February 18, 2017, at the Foley Center- Chestnut Ridge in Blowing Rock, North Carolina.

A Service to Celebrate the Life of Mrs. Inez Carnes Plyler will be conducted at 2:00 PM Tuesday, February 21, 2017, at Benton Heights Presbyterian Church, 2701 Concord Highway, Monroe, NC 28110, officiated by Reverend Paul Saleeby. Interment will follow at Lakeland Memorial Park Cemetery, 1901 Lancaster Avenue, Monroe, NC 28112.

The family will receive friends from 1:00 PM until 1:45 PM Tuesday at the church, prior to the funeral ceremony.

Mrs. Plyler was born on August 8th, 1932 in Union County, North Carolina, a daughter of the late Shuford Carnes and Kathleen Moser Carnes.

She was preceded in death by an infant daughter, Nancy Ira Plyler, her husband, I. F. Plyler; three brothers, Richard Carnes, Walter Carnes and John Robert Carnes; a sister, Lois Johnson; and a special friend, Rick Harris
