Jerry Wayne Callicutt, 75, of Albemarle passed away on Thursday, March 5, 2026.

A Funeral service will be held at 1 pm on Tuesday, March 10, 2026, at Stony Hill United Methodist Church. Burial will follow at Stanly Gardens of Memory. The family will receive friends on Monday evening March 9, 2026 from 6 pm to 8 pm at Stanly Funeral and Cremation Care of Albemarle.

Jerry was born on September 14, 1950, to the late Lacy and Exie Callicutt. He was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and friend whose kindness and generosity touched many lives.

Jerry is survived by his loving wife of 55 years, Brenda Callicutt, and his two sons, Jeremy (Sarah) Callicutt and Jason (Angie) Callicutt.
